Creating Online Tutorials Using Camtasia: 9:00 AM – 12:30 PM

Instructor: Tim Fahlberg, educational consultant, e-Instructional

Description: In this hands-on class, participants will learn how to use Camtasia studios to create web-based tutorials. Tutorials can include both video and audio components. Come with an idea of a tutorial you'd like to create, a headset with a microphone (if available), and a flash drive onto which you can save your project. Class size limited to 16 participants.

Tim Fahlberg is an educational consultant who specializes in screencasting, audience response systems, and assessment creation. Tim was a very passionate high school and college math & technology teacher for 11 years. Nine years ago he began pioneering the area of mathcasting which is screencasting showing the solution to math (shudder!?) problems by students and teachers. Tim is now working with a team of people internationally on a collaborative Wiki ([www.math247.jot.com](http://www.math247.jot.com)) that features many hundreds of mathcasts for all levels of mathematics and screencasts that share best teaching practices for educators. This wiki also has many tutorials (screencasts and documents) showing how to create, produce, and distribute mathcasts and screencasts
